WHY SPONSORSHIP?

The PAGB is constantly looking at the most cost options for everything we do. Camera Clubs and Federations work on limited budgets and we have a duty to keep our expenditure under control. Nevertheless, the cost of meetings and venues for our major competitions and Awards for Photographic Merit are constantly rising as is the cost of organising and judging those competitions.

The PAGB Executive will recommend to the AGM in April that the PAGB subscriptions remain at the same level as last year - £29 per club. This is due, in part, to the increase in sponsorship and advertising, without which your Club subscriptions would have to rise by about £6 to £7.

We think it is important to accept sponsors who also offer benefits to the club photographer, maybe in the form of reduced cost for products or cost effective services, such as public liability insurance.

Our main sponsors are **Darwin Clayton (UK) Ltd, Permajet**, **Fotospeed**, **Harman Technology** and **Fine Art Foto** plus advertisers who support our handbook and companies who generously supply raffle prizes to generate much needed income at our events.

DO CLUBS RECORD YOUR LECTURES?

It is getting fashionable in some areas for clubs to photograph a lecturer's prints so as to project them for the benefit of the audience. There are also clubs who ask to video lectures and demonstrations. It has been suggested to your editor that some clubs may have distributed and even sold CDs of such recordings to members of other clubs. I have only second party anecdotal reports and no hard evidence of such a practice but I would be very annoyed if it happened to me and I am going to be rather more vigilant in the future. I highly recommend that every lecturer and judge should seek assurance from the club that any digital copies of their prints will be deleted from the club hard-drive after the lecture and should ask how any video taken is going to be used.

LIVE-EDITING DURING JUDGING

The very fact that live editing is being discussed shows that the most important part of judging is being overlooked. To my way of thinking, the most important part of judging is being able to discuss the picture content and the story-telling ability of the image. Considering composition and technical aspects is secondary and should be in the context of enhancing the picture content. I have seen too many judges instantly home in on small compositional or technical problems. They may well be correct about the problems and correct in offering advice to help the photographer to improve the photograph but not at the expense of discussing the bigger picture.

Most judging evenings are pretty full at present and asking the judge to live-edit would be unfair to both the judges and the audience. Practical advice on changing composition or technical aspects should be covered in dedicated tutorial evenings.
