PRINTS MATTER

"(Lith) printing can offer a special kind of magic."

Tim Rudman began his involvement with Photography in the 1960's whilst studying medicine in London. He taught himself to print in the darkroom and, with his distinctive style of Black and White printing, quickly gained some early recognition and publication. His work has been exhibited in over 50 countries around the world, gaining many awards.

For many years he pursued his two loves of medicine and photography together, but now devotes his time to photography. Today he is respected internationally as a photographer, printer, author, educator and authority on darkroom printing and toning techniques. His name is particularly linked with his pioneering work in the beautiful process of Lith Printing, a process in which he is widely regarded as the leading authority and practitioner. His work and publications in this field are held to be primarily responsible for its current popularity as a photographic art form around the world.


Rudman has been a regular writer and lecturer, conducting darkroom workshops in Britain, Ireland, Spain, Australia, Canada and America. His four books on photographic printing and toning techniques are critically acclaimed and are widely used in teaching establishments. His work has been published extensively in many countries.

Rudman is a member and past Chairman of The London Salon of Photography, A Life Fellow of The Royal Photographic Society of Great Britain. He was a founder member and subsequent Chairman of the Royal Photographic Society's Distinctions Panel for Photographic Printing and has been widely involved with the Society's Distinctions assessments for some 35 years. He was awarded the Society's Fenton medal and Hon Life membership in 2013.

He is a member of the Arena group of photographers in the UK, the Freestyle Advisory Board of Photographic Professionals in Hollywood, California, USA and is an advisor to the Lishui International Handmade Photography Centre, Lishui, China. His work is represented in a number of permanent and private collections around the world, including the British Royal Family and the renowned RPS Permanent Collection housed in the Victoria and Albert museum in London.

His photographic prints are individually hand crafted in the darkroom using silver gelatine materials processed to the highest archival standards and toned mainly with selenium, gold and sulphides, both for aesthetic reasons and to ensure archival permanence.



Lith printing can offer a special kind of magic. Images can be stark and graphic or soft and ethereal. Rudman's trees can look majestic, statuesque, romantic, and poetic, vulnerable, or damaged, but always showing their own character. The seasons, environment, weather conditions and the time of day or night add to their beauty.

Rudman's combination of capturing images and his method of printing shows his work is not just about recording a photograph. He has a message far beyond the negative. His techniques of printing and toning give an extraordinary delicacy and an unexpected colour palette throughout his images. Many of the images in the exhibition are unique and not shown previously.

Tim is well known internationally for his pioneering work in Lith Printing and distinctive toning methods of Black & White silver gelatin prints. He has authored several 'go to' books and hundreds of articles in this field. He exhibits his work internationally and has taught widely around the globe.

WHY NOT ENTER AS A CLUB?

Entry as an Individual. A maximum of 5 prints may be entered, divided amongst the three Categories in any way. The fee for an Individual entry is £15.

Entry by a Club. The Club may collate the work of any number of Photographers, excluding anyone who has entered as an Individual. A maximum of 5 prints per Photographer may be entered, divided amongst the Categories in any way. The fee for a Club entry is £3 per print with a minimum Club Fee of £15.

Club Awards

Club Entrants will accrue points, and Individual Entrants will also accrue points to their Club.

- 1 point for every Print entered.
- 3 points for every Print scored 13 or over by the Judges,
- 5 points for every Print accepted into the Exhibition.

Club Awards will be based on the order of merit of total points accrued.

- The **Online Paper Gold Club** trophy will be awarded to the top Club, with a valuable prize from our Sponsor.
- There may be other awards.

Every year the FIAP hold a number of Prestigious Biennial Competitions for its member countries.

The PAGB makes an entry on behalf of 'Great Britain and Northern Ireland'.

This year we would like to invite you to take part in this selection process for the FIAP Nature Biennial by submitting up to 12 nature images across the following three categories;

- a. Birds
- b. Mammals
- c. Insects

Your entries would need to strictly comply with the FIAP nature definition and not have been used in a previous biennial competition entry.

The FIAP Competition has both Print and Digital Sections, so following a successful selection, you may be asked to provide a high resolution version (if selected for the Print entry).

Both our digital and print entries will need to be on a theme, and this will be taken into account during the select process.

30 Images will be selected in total and all images scoring more than 8 points in the actual FIAP Biennial can be used a part of a FIAP Distinction Application.

A unique limited edition PAGB Enamel Badge will be given to all authors selected to represent 'Great Britain and Northern

Ireland' in the FIAP Biennial Competition.

Please Note. Authors from clubs in the Scottish and South Wales Federations are not eligible, as their Federation makes a separate entry.

Steamy windows scored 24, again a composite taken on the North Yorkshire Moors Railway with the condensation added to the window to make a more dramatic image.






THE WPF PHOTOGRAPHIC CONFERENCE 2022


