Every year the FIAP hold a number of Prestigious Biennial Competitions for its member countries.

The PAGB makes an entry on behalf of 'Great Britain and Northern Ireland'.

This year we would like to invite you to take part in this selection process for the FIAP Nature Biennial by submitting up to 12 nature images across the following three categories;

- a. Mammals
- b. Birds

Your entries would need to strictly comply with the FIAP nature definition and not have been used in a previous biennial competition entry.

The FIAP Competition has both Print and Digital Sections, so following a successful selection, you may be asked to provide a high resolution version (if selected for the Print entry).

Both our digital and print entries will need to be on a theme, and this will be taken into account during the select process.

30 Images will be selected in total and all images will be scieded in total and all images scoring more than 8 points in the actual FIAP Biennial can be used a part of a FIAP Distinction Application.

THANK YOU ON BEHALF OF THE CHILDREN AT THE DONKERBOS PRIMARY SCHOOL AND HOSTEL, NAMIBIA

Covid - it changed all our lives in so many ways!

A change for my husband, well-known photographer Colin Westgate, was that he could no longer travel to Camera Clubs and do talks. So, Colin joined with others and continued to do talks by Zoom. However, sitting in the comfort of his own home and charging a fee, was not something Colin felt at ease with.

Therefore, he decided that if everyone in the various clubs had enjoyed his talk, he would suggest they might like to donate to a charity, run by friends Linda and Roger Bullen. The charity, 'The Catherine Bullen Foundation' being in memory of their daughter Catherine Bullen. Catherine a newly trained Doctor, died



tragically in Namibia in 2002 from severe gastroenteritis.

Linda and Roger could so easily have been angry and resentful, but the opposite happened. They started a charity in Catherine's memory, the purpose being the relief of poverty, sickness and distress and the preservation of health in rural Namibia where Catherine's young life had ended. Fundamental to all our wellbeing is access to clean water, and one of the charity's aims is the funding of community-based projects including the provision of fresh water.

Donkerbos Primary School and Hostel in the Omaheke region of rural Namibia has never had a

water supply. The children had to collect water from an incredibly long distance on a daily rota basis and they were rationed to two small glasses of drinking water a day. On the rare occasions it rained, the

rainwater would be collected in tanks and saved for the occasional bathing. Many of the children were suffering badly from scabies and the school was generally in desperate need. One of the things that really would improve life for them and many other people in the area would be their own water supply and the installation of a borehole.

In April this year the charity had enough funds to proceed and the San Bushmn, along with other experienced drillers began to search for water. A possible site was identified and before very long they had a fantastic borehole strike - 15000 litres of water per hour for the school, it was beyond everyone's wildest dreams. It was such a joyful, day with the children, teachers and the whole community celebrating that after so many years of deprivation they now had water, The Catherine Bullen Foundation have since enlisted the help of the World Food Programme who are going to

provide the school with a garden

– what a wonderful outcome.



We recently had the opportunity to travel to Namibia and meet up with Linda and Roger. We were able to see the borehole, which is situated just outside the school, for ourselves and see how the water is being brought into the school. It was such a privilege to see the healthy children and the pleasure they were getting from the precious gift of water. You can see from the pictures, just how much this is being valued, enjoyed, and appreciated.

On behalf of the children at Donkerbos School, Colin says a heartfelt 'Thank You' for all the Camera Clubs donations which went towards something incredibly special and have truly made a difference. Colin will continue to raise funds for the foundation through his zoom talks.

Organising and running an Adjudication is expensive and the PAGB is not immune to rising costs. In particular, venue and hotel costs have increased dramatically since our APM Application Fee was last adjusted. The new Application Fees, which are set at £7.50 per image, are shown below.


