








This exhibition of digital photographic art by Fife-based photographer Stan Farrow is being held in the Discovery Point in Dundee, (beside the exciting new V&A building).

Having said that the challenge of standing up in front of a live club audience is fun, remembering you are the entertainment for the evening is important and somewhat daunting. It is rewarding to put something back into photography and that is why I enjoy lecturing.

So it's onwards and upwards. I have already achieved the awards necessary for EFIAP/d2 and I am halfway to the number required for EFIAP/d3 although that application can't be lodged until the end of 2020. Who knows I may even try for MPAGB again having failed miserably several times......lol





Karin Wilson DPAGB EFIAP ARPS BPE4*



I took black and white photographs around the campus and developed them later in the Dark Room. I learnt the importance of light and composition and was totally hooked.

In 1982 I bought a Nikon F3, which I cherished for the next 25 years. During this time I enjoyed photographing my growing family, travels and celebrations. I was living in the Caribbean and I was enthralled by the wide variety of tropical birds. This sowed the seed for my current passion for photographing birds, which became my specialty subject for my recent successful ARPS Panel.

On my return to England I bought a Nikon digital camera, joined my local camera club and embraced the world of National and International Exhibitions, which has challenged and inspired me to develop my photography.

I am happiest when photographing outdoors and feel privileged my hobby has given me opportunities to see, and photograph, a cornucopia of wildlife and stunning landscapes around the British Isles and overseas. The photograph chosen for the Hall of Fame was Mountain Hare Hunkered Down, which I took in the Scottish Highlands in winter.
