


















## AWARDS FOR PHOTOGRAPHIC MERIT ONLINE ADVISORY WORKSHOP



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### HOYLAKE PHOTOGRAPHIC SOCIETY and the HOYLAKE INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITIONS

The Hoylake Photographic Society celebrates its 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year. In the first few years of the Society members were encouraged to take photographs of the area of the Hoylake Urban District as it was

then and we have a large collection of these 1950s prints, a selection of which may be found on the <u>society's website</u>. We are in the process of digitising these prints and donating them to Wirral Archives for safekeeping.

Since 2012, Hoylake has been running International Exhibitions, initially with PSA recognition and then also with FIAP and GPU patronage. You are all cordially invited to help Hoylake P.S celebrate its 75<sup>th</sup> year by entering 2025 Hoylake International.

The Hoylake International Exhibition has FIAP/GPU/PSA patronage/recognition. There are six sections – Digital – Colour Open, Mono Open and Nature. Small Prints – Colour Open, Colour Abstract, Mono Open. Closing date October 1st.

This is the third year that we have provided sections for Small Prints. For a number of

years, we ran one of the Salons in the Great British Small Print Circuit and, together with West Cumbria Photo Group, organised the Annual Print Exhibitions on behalf of the Photographic Society of America.



Just a few years ago, there were several Print exhibitions available. If we want to encourage folk to produce and enter prints in exhibitions, then we need to provide more Small Print competitions. Small Prints cost less to post, and beginners are more likely to try their hand at Small Prints. At Hoylake we are also trying to keep the cost of entry as low as possible.


Last year, in the 2024 Hoylake International we had to judge over 1600 Small Prints, 612 coming from the United Kingdom, including a good number from L&CPU clubs. Gold Medals were won by entrants from England, Scotland and Wales. The FIAP Blue Badge for the best author went to David Moyes from Dumfries C.C. in Scotland.

It is difficult to mount a hanging exhibition for any length of time, but we take our exhibitions to clubs with a 58-minute AV presentation set to music, then a break for refreshments long enough for club members to look at the selection of prints,

finishing with a 15-minute AV of the top award winners. The only charge made is to cover our travel expenses. We already have bookings from clubs in Lancashire, Cheshire and North Wales. We don't mind going further afield and combining it with a few days' break and you could encourage us by letting us know of photo opportunities in your area. 








Have you heard of Pixoroo yet? Pixoroo is a one-stop shop for Camera Clubs and amateur photographers where you can build your club websites, run club competitions, manage memberships and much more..









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Pixoroo is an integrated platform of many independent modules. You can subscribe to any module or a combination of modules to suit your needs.

We offer fast human & personal support Monday to Friday 9am - 10pm with any of the packages to get you up and running and beyond.

There are 25 active clubs on Pixoroo. Cheltenham CC, Stroud CC, Bromsgrove PS, Kempsey CC, Cirencester CC Cwmbran PS, Ludshott PS, Dublin CC, Highworth CC are some to mention

Pixoroo is new, yet it ran more than 500 club competitions of all kinds last season.

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Unlike traditional photo competitions, *People in Focus* will *not* be judged by a human panel. Instead, every image will be analysed and scored by our proprietary Al model, which has been trained using input from expert photographers to evaluate photos based on aesthetic qualities.

Of course, the use of Al in photography is controversial and we recognize that our Al doesn't replicate subjective human taste. But an Al judge does offer several significant benefits. For one, the results are unerringly consistent; Excire's Al model won't be influenced by environmental factors. An Al doesn't have good or bad days, after all! If it likes an image today, it'll like it tomorrow, too - and next month, and next year.

Also important: Our Al judge evaluates images in an *instant*. Upon submitting an image, you'll receive your current competition rank. If you score in the Top 20, your image will appear on a <u>live leaderboard</u>. Top entries may fall over the course of the month as new photos are submitted and judged, but you can always use the leaderboard to track your top photos in real time.

We've run competitions like this before, so we know that our Al model does an excellent job of recognizing those compelling, beautiful, eye-catching, and powerful images that photographers typically label as "great."

Just a couple of days to see what we mean, and for you to view the live leaderboard or to submit an image into the competition.



## **Monitor Colour vs Print Colour**

Something I'm asked about all the time when visiting Clubs and you can find lots of online advice including this very <u>useful article</u> from PermaJet. HonEd

When it comes to colour, the world of digital screens and printed media can be far more complex than people realise.

Whether you're intending to show an image as a PDI or a physical print, it is crucial to understand the differences between the colours you see on your monitor and the colours that appear on paper. These differences are due to the ways

in which colours are created, processed, and displayed in each medium. Understanding these will help you produce prints that match what you see on screen as best as possible.

There are various reasons why your prints may not match what you are seeing on screen.

- Printers and monitors are different devices, and their colour profiles don't always match. As a result, you might see one colour on the screen, but the printed version might look entirely different. To ensure a closer match, calibrating your monitor is an essential step to ensure that what you are seeing before you send it to print is accurate.
- Printers also require a form of colour calibration called an ICC profile. This is a way of telling your
  printer exactly how it should reproduce the colours in your image depending on the type of paper and
  ink you are using. Find out more about ICC profiles.
- Using a <u>daylight viewing light</u> is the best to way to assess your prints. It removes the influence of changing ambient lighting, giving you consistent results regardless of time of day or year.
- The type of paper or material used also affects the final colour output. Glossy papers will produce more vibrant colours, while a matt paper will result in a softer, less saturated look. Additionally, the paper's texture can also influence how the ink sits on the surface, affecting how the colour appears. However, it's worth remembering that the choice of paper is very personal as only the person whose image it can say if the paper is right or wrong.






