



Successful entrants receive a very special unique bronze badge, a real symbol of honour and, on acceptance to a Fifth MASTERS OF PRINT, they receive a silver version of the same badge. You too could secure one of these badges and, like other recipients, wear it with pride at photographic events.

Every accepted photographer is appointed to the MALL OF FAME and will have the opportunity to be featured in e-news in their own words and with their favourite images. Thousands of people will read your article and admire your images.

Keith Suddaby frps frps(av) mpagb efiap fbpe

For many years Southport Photographic Society had two homes. One, familiar to guests, judges and lecturers, being Emmanuel Church Hall, where meetings would take place on Monday nights throughout the season. The other, a well-appointed house on a quiet street in Birkdale. Here, at the home of Keith and the late Margaret Suddaby, it seemed that when one called that there would always be someone from the club engaged in some photographic endeavour.

Margaret and Keith first met at school but romance didn't blossom immediately but, in 1958 they married - a partnership that lasted 58 years until Margaret's sudden passing in 2016.

Keith was a man of enormous talent, boundless energy and a generosity of spirit that overflowed into every aspect of his hobby. He took huge pleasure in sharing his love of photography with both new and established members. Help and encouragement were his watchwords.



Born in Kingston upon Hull in the spring of 1934, he proved to be a gifted scholar, gaining a place at Oxford where he graduated in English. A life in academia seemed inevitable, however his time in National Service was to change the course of his future. He was ordered to work in military stores and it was there that he found he had a talent for organisation. One thing led to another and so began a career in business. At one time Keith moved with Margaret and their three children, Mark, Helen and Jamie, to Australia. Later in life he proudly boasted to me that he had been the man who introduced Pedigree Chum to the Australian market.

Returning to the UK he eventually took over the ownership of a tea producing company, turning it around from a failing business to one which would go on to supply its products to Sainsbury's and Marks & Spencer.

Keith's prowess in the photographic world was rewarded with not one but two RPS Fellowships, a Masters from the Photographic Alliance and recognition from FIAP to add to the FBPE gained in this country. In 2005 he was honoured by the Royal Photographic Society who awarded him the prestigious Fenton Medal.


Each summer he and Margaret opened their home and garden to host their legendary RPS garden parties. Prominent photographers could be found in all corners of the house, including Keith's own darkroom, discussing the work of prospective candidates for distinctions and dispensing advice.

Such was his commitment to SPS that he had a whole wall of shelving erected in his garage to store the hundreds of prints and boxes that were submitted annually for the National Exhibition run by the club. In addition to which he and Margaret offered overnight accommodation for the selectors, some of whom had been invited to stay on an extra night in order to lecture at the club on the Monday night. It was a common sight to see a weary selector relaxing with a dram of single malt at Keith's fireside following an intense day of judging. There were few big names on the photography scene that Keith didn't know. And he was able to twist the most reluctant of arms to come to the club to show their work.

Southport Photographic Society and indeed the whole of the photographic community benefited immeasurably from Keith's drive, his loyalty and his generosity. He will be sadly missed.

And why not organise a Club Entry?

Entry as an Individual.

A maximum of 5 prints may be entered, divided amongst the three Categories in any way. The fee for an Individual entry is £15, even if you enter fewer than 5 prints.

Entry by a Club.

The Club may collate the work of any number of Photographers, who hasn't entered as an Individual. A maximum of 5 prints per Photographer may be entered, divided amongst the Categories in any way. The fee for a Club entry is £3 per print with a minimum Club Fee of just £15



The Open GB Trophy went to Catchlight Camera Club and Poulton-le-Fylde PS were winners of the GB Cup for Nature.


The Rod Wheelans Quaich was won by Derwood Pamphilion of Bristol PS and a representative collected the award on his behalf. Well done to everyone who took part.


