We are pleased to announce that the GB Cup and the GB Trophy are now open.

The GB Trophy for Prints remains free of charge to encourage you to print more and we will accept both A3 and A4.
There are two categories,
Open and Nature.

The GB Cup for PDI
Is charged at 60p per image and
has the following categories,
Open, Nature and
Limited Eligibility, designed
especially for smaller clubs.

In previous years the GB Trophy Prints were only exhibited in folders at The Photography Show but now they are formed into an exciting travelling portfolio which is available to view "in YOUR hands" at YOUR Club. This is a great opportunity to view, handle and discuss the Accepted Prints.

Another great reason for your Club to enter as your prints will be seen by other club members all over the UK. And, of course, you can have it too!

The portfolio is FREE to hire but Clubs are required to pay the postage to its next location and perhaps from its current location unless this is another Club.

PAGB ONLINE ADVISORY SERVICE

Do you want to chat to someone about your potential entry for one of our Awards? David Smith has just allocated the 350th person to the APM Online Advisory Service and this service is available to you whenever you need it.

Some Federations are fortunate enough to have an extensive list of advisors but others don't have the same resource. If you cannot find anyone local then our Online Advisory Service may be an answer. **CLICK HERE** to read more in **APM Leaflet 6**.

Remember that advice given by an Adviser or a Mentor is entirely a personal opinion, although it should be well informed by experience and recent knowledge of the APM. Advisers will be as honest and accurate as they can but, on the day, the Adjudicators may not agree with them. Our service permits you to ask for a second opinion but, ultimately, you must make your own decisions and choices.

FACE TO FACE WORKSHOPS

The PAGB team offer Awards for Photographic Merit (APM) workshops to Federations which you can read about in our <u>APM Leaflet 3</u>. A small PAGB team attends to explain the APM, show work at the appropriate standard for each level and look at the work of prospective entrants who bring their images on the day. Often we include an interactive exercise where you get to assess the prints on display. Currently we are booked for January in Scotland, the L&CPU in February, May in the CACC and the EAF, where the November Adjudication will be held, in July. These events are advertised within the Federation and may be made available beyond their boundary.




Telling Stories – Building Series with Kaisa Siren Saturday 17 January at 3.00pm London Time

In the presentation Kaisa will lead us through her process and how she uses ICM photography to build bodies of work telling a story. As Kaisa has a background in photojournalism, images unrelated to one another are not as interesting to her as much as a sequence telling a story. With semi abstract images as ICM photographs often are, the story is not written in full form by the photographer but completed in the mind of the viewer.
