


My fascination with nature and love of nature photography have their origins in the inspiring wildlife programmes of the 1950's and 1960's. It didn't matter whether it was Armand and Michaela Dennis on the plains of East Africa, Peter Scott telling us to "Look" or Jacques Cousteau who was "Diving to Adventure", I dreamed of doing what they did and, I guess, the wish to capture the experience with a camera must have been buried somewhere pto

in my subconscious. Fast forward to the early 70's and I at last got my hands on an SLR, my wife's Practika, which I quickly discovered was fine for recording friends and family, but with only a 135mm lens was not a lot of use for capturing wildlife.

Though I up-graded my kit in the following years, wildlife photography continued to take a back seat to family, travel and landscapes, and that remained the situation until 2011 when I retired and decided to join my first camera club. Ludshott Photographic Club opened my eye to what was achievable. Although Ludshott is a small village club, it has always competed in events organised by the Surrey Photographic Association and enters the GB Cup annually. Whilst we cannot compete with the larger clubs, entering federation and national competitions gives our members the opportunity to compete against and see some of the best images produced by UK club photographers. I've found involvement with these competitions inspiring.

Ludshott has traditionally been strong in producing nature images, which encouraged me to develop my interest, but joining the club has also showed me that there were other genres that I could and should develop to get the most from my hobby. The club encourages members to aspire to PAGB or RPS distinction. I initially followed the RPS route, gaining ARPS with a Nature panel in 2015, which was based on the birds in my home county of Hampshire, and this provided a foundation for a successful submission for DPAGB in 2016. TIM PILE FELLOW OF THE IRISH PHOTOGRAPHIC FEDERATION MPAGB ARPS EFIAP/s



This panel is the result of a collaboration between one model and one photographer.

We set out to integrate and juxtapose her with both man-made and natural environments, to portray her versatility in posing, and to use all natural light in order to reveal her beauty, shape and form.

I was awarded my Associateship of the Irish Photographic Federation (AIPF) in 2012 with a panel of nudes, and like many photographers, thought about how to advance to a Fellowship, without really having a clue about how to get there. There is no easy definition of the standard required but, one piece of advice I was given, was that I'd know a Fellowship panel when I saw it! At the time, I thought this most unhelpful! I am not really a panel photographer. A panel is a cohesive set of images and I try to make my images as different from each other as I can, and I have generally worked towards producing individual images with impact that will do well in FIAP exhibitions.



A year or two later, I started putting together prospective panels and asking fellow photographers, what they thought of the them. My heart wasn't really in it, and even I could see that they were just 20 'good' images, on a loosely similar theme. When I had shown panels, a common comment was that, if I included more than 3-4 photos

of the same model in the panel, it could be classed as repetition causing the panel to fail. This was a major problem, as I tended to work with a small group of models. So, I gave up trying, and just carried on doing what I enjoyed, producing images.

At about the same time as putting the Fellowship on the back burner I started working with a new model, Lulu Lockhart. We get on very well together and soon had a great working relationship, that was also extremely productive. Then one day I had the idea that, if 3-4 images of the same model was repetition in a panel, what



about all 20 of the same model? A Fellowship should be about doing something different, and, whilst slightly risky, this was different. The model would be the theme, and the variety would be achieved with 20 different poses and locations.

Lulu and I are extremely prolific producing images, and I printed out over 60 at A6 size and then started playing around with them, finding pairs of images that matched, and, finally, putting together a draft panel with the help of a fellow photographer. The photographer who said "I'd know a Fellowship panel when I saw it" was right, and I knew that I had the makings of a successful panel. I then refined the image selection, asking advice from people whose opinion I valued, and also asking the IPF for someone in the organisation I could ask for advice from. I'm very grateful for all their help and could not have been successful without them.

Strangely enough putting together the Statement of Intent was one of the hardest parts, as I knew what the panel was about but found it hard putting it into words, I usually let the images speak for themselves, but it's critical that you don't say things in the statement that are not achieved in the panel.

I've heard it said that models are just the subject of the images, and that's their only contribution. With all the models, I have worked with I can tell you that this is not the case, they are extremely creative and the quality of the model generally shows in the final image. This is most the case in my panel, a photographer said of my panel "Never mind the photographer, I think the model deserves a Fellowship", I couldn't agree more.

I'm extremely honoured to have been awarded the Fellowship, as I join many great Irish and other photographers I know who have also achieved it. I'm really proud of my panel, and I thank the IPF for giving me the motivation to produce it.

Working a full-time job, and having two young children, I don't get as much time as I would like to get out and take photos so I had to come up with a way of keeping my photography quick and easy to do when I have a few spare hours.

I try to steer away from taking the same photos you see in magazines and online, and I tend to the surreal and darker side of photography. Thinking outside the box, creating impact with a shock factor, to make people stop, look and think about what's going on.

I decided to buy a few masks to take some self-portraits, to composite them into another background later. This quickly grew into sourcing props and outfits to create characters and storylines. Most of my self-portraits are taken outside in open shade, so that I can adjust my own lighting and effects later in Photoshop. I always start with taking the masked character photo first then choosing or shooting the appropriate background later.

Each photo takes around 3 to 6 hours work from shooting the first photo to saving the final image. My most complex photo to date is "It's All on The Line", which took more than 6 months of planning and which is made up from 15 individual photos and over 15 hours work in Photoshop to complete. I'm now very friendly with a local mask company "Ministry of Masks" who kindly send me masks to shoot at leisure so there are plenty of new ideas on the horizon.



World-renowned photographer Joe McNally FRPS has selected Gold, Silver and Bronze medal winners from the shortlisted entries for the RPS Members' Biennial Exhibition 2017. The Gold medal is awarded to Scotland-based wildlife photographer **Michael Durham FRPS** for his astonishing image Predator and Prey.

A professional photographer for over 10 years, Durham gained his Fellowship from The RPS in 2013. Based in Dumfries, South West Scotland, he spends time photographing native wildlife around Scotland's wild landscapes, as well as further afield in Northern Scandinavia. However, his medal-winning image, capturing a fleeting moment in which a young male sparrow hawk swoops in to grab its prey, was shot in his own garden. In selecting the image for Gold, Joe McNally said "This is the moment, plain and simple. Tack sharp, peak action, good light, and well managed background."

SH PHOTOGRAPHIC FEDERATION MEMORIAL TROPHIES DAY



In a new format, the WPF held 3 Competitions in a single day in the very comfortable surroundings in Llantwit Fardre near Pontypridd. Almost 80 WPF members and friends were in attendance, and were treated to a feast of top quality photography. We were delighted to welcome our judge from Scotland, Rod Wheelans MPAGB MFIAP FIPF HonPAGB HonSPF, Past President of the PAGB, who gave a concise assessment of almost 300 images, with a huge dose of wit and good humour. 26 WPF Clubs competed in at least one of the competitions, with most Clubs entering all three.

In a further new departure for the WPF, the WALTER MORGAN TROPHY for Monochrome Images was judged as a panel of 4 prints from each Club. Three Clubs had their panels displayed at a time and the judge selected one panel to be eliminated, to be replaced by a panel from another Club. The judge gave his assessment of the prints in each of the eliminated panels. It was an exciting way to see a competition judged, and Rod often found it difficult to choose which panel to eliminate, as the standard of most entries was very high. Rhondda Camera Club eventually won, after a very tense few rounds. The general opinion was that this was an innovative and exciting way of judging the competition and everyone was full of admiration for Rod's assessment of previously unseen images.

Best of National and Regional Wildlife Photography Goes on Show

Dumfries Camera Club marks platinum year with a festival exhibition while Gracefield hosts Britain's best nature photos Dumfries Camera Club (DCC) is celebrating the start of its 70th anniversary year – during which it will stage a special exhibition as part of the Wildlife Film Festival Scotland (WFFS), 24-26 Mar 2017.

At the same time, Gracefield Arts Centre will host the British Wildlife Photography Award (BWPA) exhibition, 4 Mar – 15 Apr, also as part of the festival. The winning image for 2016 is an underwater picture of a jellyfish taken in Scotland and among the other pictures on display one is by the outgoing DCC president, Mick Durham.

WFFS is a celebration of the natural world through film, photography, topical discussion, music and more. It takes place from 24-26 March and its central themes will be Amazing Journeys, Wild Places and Rewilding. Some 30 films are being screened, many of them winners of coveted Wildscreen Panda Awards (the wildlife Oscars). Naturalists and broadcasters Simon King (Big Cat Diary) and Iolo Williams (Springwatch) will be among the 20 speakers along with Sacha Dench "the human swan" who flew a motorised paraglider 4,500 miles from the Arctic to the UK with migrating Bewick's swans.



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

Why did I chose this particular image?

The Purpose of my Image



"If at first you don't succeed, destroy all evidence that you tried!" Anonymous

As a photographer, you'll no doubt be asking some questions about your own work. What is it that I want people to see? What is my message to others? What is the meaning behind my work? When this becomes clear, it will be much easier to select a style of mount to suit your work.

If you want someone to see a key feature, then a step mount could be a good option; if you wish to bring out the light, have a think about the mount colour; for an intense and detailed image, perhaps keep your mount simple. The mount is there to enhance your image, rather than to overwhelm it; use it to your benefit.


