We will have several Adjudicators in attendance each day to discuss any work you wish to bring along – Print or PDI – and, if you take their advice, this will give you a much better chance of success

- 1 What day are you coming?
- 2 Do you want a morning or afternoon appointment?
- 3 What level are you interested in CPAGB, DPAGB or MPAGB?
- 4 Are you intending to apply in Print or PDI?
- 5 Will you bring Print or PDI for us to look at?
- 6 Have you applied, or have you been accepted to an Adjudication?
- 7 Which Club & Federation are you a member of?

You can bring unmounted Prints, even at A4, but we will not be able to store them on our stand. Left luggage facilities are available in the NEC. Bring your PDI on a stick. Please do not bring too many pictures. A maximum of 15 for CPAGB, 20 for DPAGB and 30 for MPAGB.

We strongly advise that you bring your images in Print if you are applying in Print, otherwise our advice can only speak to the content and not the quality of the print.

Bring your PDI, preferably not larger than

H1600px x V1200px, on a stick. We will probably be viewing them on a Mac laptop. If you bring them on a tablet or a phone, we can only speak to the content and not the quality of the image when it is projected.

I will be away from home for most of February and my access to e-mail may be sporadic. Please apply now for a place and I will take applications in date order. I'm sure that everyone will get a slot, but I may not be able to confirm until early March.

## LOVE OF LANDSCAPE by CHARLIE WAITE FRPS FBIPP

I am told that, every day 350,000,000 photographs are uploaded to Facebook and 85,000,000 to Instagram and it is very gratifying to know that a huge proportion of images are of the landscape from all over the world.

What does this tell us?

Surely it tells us that there is an imbedded need for individuals to enjoy and celebrate the beauty of our planet using the camera as a conduit to ensure the most profound relationship they can have with their world at the time of making their image.



I have spoken to very many landscape photographers who practice their craft both in their country and in the United Kingdom. The word beautiful always comes up multiple times, to my mind landscape photography is surely that, a celebration of beauty and our wonder and amazement of it. The key element we all agree on is to produce a photograph that has parity with our own human response. It's for this reason that we are determined to return, time and time again, to produce an image that tells our own particular story as we, and only we, would wish it to be told.

Over the years I have been privileged to have been invited to speak at photographic clubs and this is a wonderful opportunity for me to express my gratitude and my admiration to all those photographers who support their respective clubs and societies. For it is you that

keep photography alive and current in the U.K., allowing so many people to become familiar with, and to understand what the essence of photography amounts to.

I have heralded landscape photography for many years but of course I'm not the first to do so. It has long been known that having a relationship with the natural world is just plain good for us and having a relationship with the camera in between provides us with immense joy and enrichment. It is photography societies and clubs who contribute to multiple exhibitions up and down the U.K allowing the image which could so easily be imprisoned in the external hard drive, never allowed to see the light of day. So, thank you most wholeheartedly to the programme secretaries, the presidents and the volunteers who quite simply do so much in the name of photography, but especially landscape photography.

The landscape photography community speak a language that surpasses their own. We all know what we love so much, and we all wish that we could have more time to practice our craft, to immerse ourselves in the beauty of our world.

With all of the above in mind, it made sense for me to create an award based around a competition that celebrated our remarkable country. I also knew that there were a large number of non-professional, yet hugely talented, landscape photographers who were not only exceptionally good at their craft, but had a deep passion for the landscape of the U.K.

But there was no dedicated landscape photography competition existing at that time. Hence the creation of Landscape Photographer of the Year, which now is enjoying its 13th year. Since its conception I have seen countless breath taking photographs and I'm sure this current year will provide many more.



Charlie Waite is now firmly established as one of the world's leading Landscape photographers. He was born in 1949 and worked in British Theatre & Television for the first ten years of his professional life. Throughout this period he became fascinated by theatrical lighting and design. Gradually the landscape and the way it can be revealed to us through light and shade stole him away from the acting profession. His style is unique, in that his photographs convey a spiritual quality of serenity and calm. He has established a reputation for his particular approach to his work. His photographs are held in private and corporate collections throughout the world.

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## **Success** with Adrian Lines

Along with my real job, my photography, my committee and software work for the PAGB and my own federation, I also have a small software development company called Datascribe Ltd. Under this banner I am promoting a couple of new websites I have developed to help both **Photography Exhibition Entrants** and **Club Competition Secretaries**. Both of these projects started out for my own purposes but have now grown into something that I can offer to the wider world.



The Competition Image Management
System can be found at https://cimgr.com

The first project is an online 'Competition Image Management System' (CIMGR), designed to simplify record keeping for National and International Exhibitions.

It allows users to upload digital versions of their images and then allocate them to the various exhibitions and competitions, entering the relevant scores and awards as they are received. The system can then provide image activity reports along with organisation specific target reports, for BPE, FIAP and PSA.

We already have around 50 active members, but we have space for plenty more. To register, just visit the website and click on the 'Register New Account' button.

This service is completely free and is funded by sponsorship and advertising


The second project is an online 'Club Competition Entry System' (SuCCESs), designed to allow clubs to manage entries to their competitions.

Club Competition Secretaries can create a primary club account and then publish their competitions. Club members can then upload their images and titles to the website. When ready, the Competition Secretary can download the images, formatted for whatever system they use on the night. The system works particularly well with Dicentra.

After the competition, Club Competition Secretaries can then re-upload the scores to the system and use it to send out results to their members. This system removes the need for USB dongles, CDs and emailed images and it can check dimensions and can automatically produce the correct naming formats, saving the competition organiser time and effort.

This facility is also free, if no charges are made to the entrants. (Such as a Salon or Exhibition). This service is funded by sponsorship, advertisers and organisations charging entry.

To register either a primary club account, or club member account, just visit the website and click on the relevant link.

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


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
