I am a passionate street photographer. I have in the past moderated my work to fit in with what I think is expected at camera club, hence my awards and distinctions, but now I concentrate my efforts to that genre.



I have for many years been a member of Tenby and District C.C., where my style of work is appreciated. I am also on the panel that chooses images for external competitions but am very reluctant to put forward my own work. I hear myself saying "Well it is not really camera club style work" Should it be? Is it? It has had mixed reactions in the past and I feel not worth the risk to our club's success.

The amount of street photography seen in club circles seems to be limited but I have, in the past few years, found an outlet for my work, away from the camera club scene, where I feel that this genre is better understood.

Street photography and documentary photography, in my opinion, should be photo reality. My street photography has not been manipulated, meaning nothing has been taken out or put in and no presets used. I do crop and "edit" in Lightroom. Street photography is extremely difficult as you have seconds to see, compose and take an image. It has to be more than a record shot. You have to know your camera well and have lots of patience as "hits" are limited.

I am constantly evolving and my style of work seems to be divided into two categories. I am drawn to how people interact with their environment and at the same time I enjoy capturing the stories and emotions of people in their daily lives. I hope my love of people and places is reflected in my work.













Masters of Print Hall of Fame

I was absolutely delighted that my image 'Fallen Aviators' was accepted into the SEVENTH MASTERS OF PRINT. The image was taken at Lake Trasimeno in Italy. The monument in the photograph is in honour of the Fallen of the Seaplane Pilots School of the Italian Army. I love taking and printing this type of photograph, using long exposure (in this case about 6 minutes), to smooth out the water and sky and producing this high key minimalist style of image, which is so well suited to printing on fine art textured papers.

I have been a keen photographer for most of my adult life, and I have been a member of my local camera club, Bangor & North Down for over 30 years. My main interest is in producing monochrome prints on the many beautiful fine art papers which are available to us today. The printmaking is the part of photography I enjoy the most, I am always experimenting with new papers, my latest purchase has been some Japanese printing papers, and I am looking forward to trying them out.

The subjects which I photograph include architecture, landscapes and seascapes, mostly these are travel images, but I am trying to create more images taken near to my home in Northern Ireland. I do enter competitions, but mostly where there is the possibility of my images being published in a book or magazine, or where my prints might be included in a photography exhibition. I really enjoy seeing my images in a book like the MASTERS OF PRINT and it always makes my day when the book arrives in the post.





EXCELLENCE AWARD OF THE PAGB (EPAGB)

<< Presentation of her EPAGB Certificate to Wendy Stowell of Chorley P.S., by James Hardy CPAGB LRPS AFIAP Hon LCPU, Past President of the L&CPU.

Wendy gained the award at the very first EPAGB Adjudication in November 2023

Only existing holders of the DPAGB Award may apply for the EPAGB and none of the images used at DPAGB may be used for EPAGB.

15 Prints are required and a total score of 330 or more will gain the Award.

The Adjudicators assess at the same level as for DPAGB and are looking for photographs that, in their opinion, should be good enough to achieve a high level of acceptance in Open Exhibitions but, although there can be a much greater commonality of standard at exhibition there still considerable level. are variations **Exhibitions** and cannot therefore be relied upon to define a consistent "Exhibition Standard".









<< This is my second acceptance, as I was also included in MASTERS OF PRINT 5, with my image 'Grundtvigs Church', which also won me a sponsor's prize of £150 worth of photographic paper, a very welcome bonus!

A PICTURE OF SUCCESS

An initiative driven by Newton Abbot Photographic Club (NAPC) in south Devon has been a huge success. In an effort to raise awareness of photography as an art form, and to appeal to a new generation of photographers, the Club hosted its first "Pop-Up Photographic Exhibition", which featured work from A-Level students from Newton Abbot College, Coombeshead Academy and South Dartmoor Community College, alongside work by Club members.



Taking place on the 6th February 2024 at Newton Abbot's Courtenay Centre, the exhibition attracted a steady stream of visitors from the moment the doors opened at 5pm.

There were two exhibition spaces. In the main hall, printed images, were displayed. Alongside the work of the students, visitors were able to view examples of their 'scrapbooks', in which they catalogued their meticulous planning. In a smaller room, they enjoyed a rolling slideshow of projected images which gave exhibitors the opportunity to show more images than would otherwise have been possible.

Julia Payne, Art Subject Team Leader at Newton Abbot College, said: "Our students, parents and staff who attended were overwhelmed and so proud that their work had been included. They were also incredibly

inspired by the photographic work of the other schools and Club members. It was a

Masters of Print Hall of Fame

It was a great surprise have a print accepted into the MOP exhibition. In recent years, I have really enjoyed visiting the exhibition when it has come to Wilkinson's in Liverpool. This year, entered for the first time and I



feel very privileged and very honoured, especially, as the image selected was taken outside Goodison Park, home of the football team I have supported for nearly sixty years.

I've long had an interest in photography and spent a chunk of my student grant in the early 1980's on an Olympus OM-10 back (it still works!).

In 2016, I joined Heswall P.S. and being in a club, I think, is the best way to improve your photography. Nowadays, I'm a 'NikOlympian,' using Nikon Z-mount and Olympus gear, the latter, especially, where portability is a factor.

I dabble in most genres, but my main interests are in architecture, street and, railways - something

that rarely succeeds in club competitions,. I find these suit monochrome, my preferred medium. I do try to have people in my photos as, not only do they provide a sense of scale, but they also add interest and a narrative to an image.

When I retired, two years ago, I embarked upon a project to photograph the Settle and Carlisle Railway and, rather than confine myself to photographing trains, stations, viaducts and tunnels, I've found enjoyment photographing the towns, villages and features of the landscape through which the line passes.

When I started the project, the plan was to put together a photobook, telling the story of my railway 'odyssey,' but such is the volume of material that I have, it's looking more likely to be three or four books! This year I hope to fill a few remaining gaps and start compiling the books.
