
Next stop will be the Gracefield Arts Centre, Edinburgh Road, Dumfries from 2-26 July 2025


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



I took my 12 year old son to <u>Derby City Photographic Clubs</u> session on wildlife photography last Tuesday and he enjoyed it a great deal. I thought I would encourage you to take your children or grandchildren and/or invite young people to some of your sessions too. I see the following benefits in doing this for young people.


- Exposure to high-quality creative outputs
- Exposure to educational content.
- Creating opportunities and realities for young people beyond the online world.
- Knowing helpful adults in the city who are not family or teachers may help develop a feeling of increased safety
- Having an opportunity to go with a parent or grandparent for an evening out is rest, education and a bonding experience in one.
- Creative inspiration.
- Confidence in approaching adults and asking questions.
- Promotion of the club culture to the next generation.
- Bridging the divide between generations. Integration of youth and minorities.
- Learning about ethical sportsmanship through photographic contests.

I understand that you might need to limit the number of child or young people who attend each session and you might make further conditions on participation but I think it is worth the effort. Perhaps, in your programmes you could indicate when children are welcome and put a price on their attendance? I'm leaving this with you and your clubs to consider. Regards to all.
