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

Thank you for giving me this amazing great news that I have received a Judges Silver Medal for my photography "No Longer of Use". These images were taken on my photography trip to Saskatchewan, Canada in February 2025. A friend and I spent 4 weeks traveling 12,000 miles around the province in temperatures which went down to -40 to -44 degrees C photographing abandoned properties. We had done some research beforehand about abandoned buildings but

inevitably there were some places we couldn't find and others that we found with the help of very friendly locals. Sadly, some places no longer exist, deteriorated to extinction by the severe weather conditions or burnt down.



The majority of the images were taken with my Canon RF 24-105 lens, focus stacking as required, with a few images taken with the Tilt and Shift lens. For clothing, I wore five layers(!), Baffin insulated boots with foot warmers, great woollen gloves with hand warmers, and when needed some skiing goggles as the wind threatened to freeze my contact lenses!

I love landscape/seascape photography but also Street Photography which often takes me to India - such a difference in climate, temperatures and cultures!

## Rising Talent – Winner

I first entered Travel Photographer of the Year (TPOTY) in 2014 when, with beginners luck, I was Runner-up in Monochrome and had the thrill of seeing my image on show at the Royal Geographical Society. Fired with enthusiasm, I have entered every TPOTY since, but apart from a few "Commended", I have never hit such heights again - until now. A truly wonderful surprise, and proof that it can pay to keep on hanging in!

With entries from 160 countries, TPOTY has grown since 2014, and for me it represents all that's best in travel photography. I especially enjoy the broad interpretation of "travel", to include street, portraits, wildlife and abstracts - a refreshing contrast to narrower definitions. The work of past winners is stunning in quality and variety and it's an absolute honour to be in such company.

Entrants in this portfolio category were invited to submit 6 images exemplifying at least three elements of travel photography. My entry included people and landscapes, beauty and dereliction, in both colour and monochrome.

1. Girls of the OvanKhumbi tribe in Angola, wearing the distinctive hair style which marks the completion of their initiation ceremony.
2. Iguazu Falls on the Brazil/Argentina border. The birds in flight are snail kites, one of the few animals to thrive in these extreme conditions.
3. An Ovahonda woman at a local market in southern Angola, with her tiny charge securely strapped to her back.






It would be nice also if you were to include 50-75 words about yourself or the image and I will be happy for you to include a web address to more of your images if you wish.

Here are some of the best camera club entries to round nine of APOY 2025 - Urban Life



**CAMERA CLUB HIGHEST SCORE**

**Wendy Davies, Alton Camera Club**  
**Where did you get that hat?**

Fujifilm X-T5, 18-50mm at 18mm, 1/500sec at f/11, ISO 6400

Wendy's excellent shot has instant appeal and was placed first overall in this round. The story is immediately clear, and her timing and compositional skills are spot on. This is the kind of image that unfolds only to someone who has their camera and settings at the ready at all times, and Wendy has made the most of the three rows of hats, placing the male figure, whose hat completes the scene, to fill what would otherwise be an empty space. A few inches to the right or left and all balance would be lost. The image has a definite Doisneau-esque feel about it, and even the tiny detail of the label on the man's T-shirt poking out adds to the overall charm.

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# Inter-Club Print Championship – New Venue

The 2026 PAGB Inter-Club Print Championship will be held on **Saturday 24 October 2026** and it will be held at **Harper Adams University at Newport, Shropshire**. Westholme School in Blackburn has become increasingly expensive and has other issues with changes to the hiring conditions. Clubs from the southern part of England have also asked if a midlands venue was possible because Blackburn required an overnight stay when the PDI Championship in Warwick did not.

**Please note that this is  
Newport, Shropshire, not  
Newport Gwent, in Wales**

Harper Adams University in Newport is 15 miles from junction 15 of the M6 and a 20 minute drive from Stafford station on the West Coast mainline and a taxi to the venue, depending on traffic conditions, around £25-£30. There's also an hourly bus which takes 35 mins (£2). Telford Station is nearer but doesn't have as many fast trains but has links Birmingham Airport. Birmingham airport is 47 miles away from Newport with Manchester airport 58 miles away. Newport has a Premier Inn 4 miles from the university and there is lots of accommodation in Telford, including a Premier Inn, a Holiday Inn and a Ramada Hotel.

There will be free parking and WiFi and we will be using the modern **Weston Lecture Theatre**. Teas, coffees and sandwiches are available in a coffee bar about 5 minutes' walk from the lecture theatre and lunch boxes can also be provided if ordered in advance. Watch for more information in e-news nearer the time, including ticket arrangements.

*and finally...* At a recent event I was handed a thin document wallet which had come with a bunch of what were otherwise empty folders and wallets purchased from a charity shop. The buyer recognized that it might be of interest and passed it to a friend who passed it to me. I found the contents to be really interesting and perhaps a few old codgers like me may also be intrigued.

On the outside of the rather battered wallet were the letters PAGB, scrawled in felt tip pen. Inside I found a document outlining the first rules to achieve one of our Awards for Photographic Merit, based on a draft that I had offered some months earlier. I note that we originally referred to these as CAPA, DAPA and MAPA, the Credit, Distinction and Master Award of the Photographic Alliance which is how we referred to ourselves in those ancient times. By the time of the first Adjudication in April 1994 and the invitation was printed – no e-mail or websites then – these had changed to our current designations, CPAGB, DPAGB and MPAGB. A maximum of 50 Applicants were invited to submit Prints or Colour Transparencies at a cost of £50, whichever level you applied for. MPAGB was not available as the Applicant had to achieve DPAGB first.

That Adjudication was in Darwen (L&CPU) under the Chairmanship of Ian Platt but the results aren't in the wallet for that Adjudication or the next in Bristol (WCPF) but it does contain a list of the 17 who achieved CPAGB and 22 who achieved DPAGB in Bottisham (EAF) in April 1995 and the 27 CPAGB, 28 DPAGB and, for the first time 9 MPAGB successful in Gateshead (NCPF) in November that year.

We don't get that level of passes at MPAGB now but don't think it was any easier. Remember that most of the applicants were well-established, long-serving, highly experienced photographers. I have to say that since I was one of them! Unfortunately very few of the 9 are still with us.
