2010 was the hardest year of my life, the end of one era and a new beginning. I was a web developer working in a successful design team. My career was successful and life was good.



My daughter, who was born with a disability, seemed to crumble overnight. She went from a main stream high school to a hospital ward, living off morphine and a cocktail of medication. She was born with no proper hip joints and things went from bad to worse. I gave up work and prepared myself to help her going through multiple surgeries and no school for the next year and a half. She slept a lot and I had to do something with myself. That is how my photography came to life.

I bought my first D-SLR in 2011 and I soon realised that I needed a club that suited me. I turned to Wigan 10 and put my lack of experience on the table. I'm not sure what happened, whether they saw something in me or I saw something in them, but it just worked and they have been

absolutely fantastic. I put my Wacom pen to the tablet, dried my tears and began to create. All I needed were the right people to support me, but more importantly to believe in me. I wanted to create images that came from the emotion within. I built images in my head, even if I knew they were nothing like those on the club scene, because to me images are like songs, you can't sing them unless you feel them.

I think it is a misconception that you need a vast amount of equipment or years of photographic experience to produce a good image. You need heart and a fire in your belly as someone once told me. Never judge yourself by others work and never think you're not good enough. Photograph for the love of it.



## WOULD YOU LIKE AN EASY WAY TO RUN PROJECTED DIGITAL IMAGE CLUB COMPETITIONS ONLINE?

#### PICTURK.COM MAY HAVE THE SOLUTION FOR YOU.

Club competitions help people to improve their photography, show their work and get constructive feedback. Unfortunately running them can be time consuming and repetitive. "Not any more", says Paul Geraghty from Picturk.com. Picturk.com is a free, online service for camera clubs that cures the administrative headaches associated with running camera club PDI monthly competitions.

"There were no easy online tools for camera clubs to help them run competitions and manage membership. Clubs use a bunch of ad hoc processes to run their PDI competitions and manage their membership. We knew that there was a better way and that we could make an easy-to-use online service for camera clubs and societies – and we did".

"Using the old way, we reckon that it takes competition officers 8 hours to set-up and administer the average club competition – scheduling competitions, updating the Club website or Facebook page, collecting the images by email/memory stick/CD, sorting them, ensuring that they are in the right format, sending them to judges for scoring, collecting the judges feedback, displaying the images on competition nights, updating the leader board – it takes five minutes using Picturk."

"It's really simple with a Picturk. Create a competition, invite a judge to score the photos, invite your members to take part. Picturk does the rest."

The Picturk system creates a competition web page where members upload their photographs, the system checks and makes sure that photographs are the right size and in the right format. Judges score them and give feedback online. On judging-night the results are announced and the judge can use Picturk.com to present the photographs and give feedback. The club league leader-board is automatically updated with the scores. Members can come back at any time and review all photographs and feedback."

## UK CLUBS IN THE PHOTOGRAPHIC SOCIETY OF AMERICA INTER-CLUB COMPETITIONS

In the 2011/2012 season 10 UK clubs have taken part in the PSA inter-club competitions. These are open to any club who has membership of the PSA and there are other clubs not in the USA who take part. There are

inter-club competitions in all the PSA divisions and a club can choose to enter just one division or all of them. Entry is free to member clubs.

Depending on the division there are three or four rounds each year. Some divisions have more than one group and promotion or relegation from one group to the next takes place each year. Apart from the print division all the others are done on line and once a club is established it can be asked to also judge one of the competition rounds.

It is good fun to be involved in, not a lot of work and good to compete with other clubs from around the world.

## MY PHOTOGRAPHIC ADVENTURE TO AFRICA

As a keen photographer who fell in love with safari whilst living in South Africa the next logical step was to take the plunge and go on a dedicated photography safari. And what a safari it was! From the start of the trip, when I sat next to a National Geographic cameraman on the plane to Ruaha, to the last evening spent with a pack of wild dogs it was a holiday I won't forget.

The combination of Ruaha and the Selous in southern Tanzania worked really well with their contrasting landscapes and different habitats and the game in both parks was plentiful. The accommodation throughout the trip was beautiful and the service was second to none. Living in such luxury whilst being the middle of the bush was a fantastic experience with dinner under the stars in Ruaha being one of the highlights. We were treated to some incredible sightings including wild dogs, cheetahs and lots of lion! Having the added benefit of excellent guiding and likeminded photographers in the jeeps meant that we were able to take the time to get some great shots and weren't speeding from sighting to see as much game as possible. This was a real difference I noticed by being on a dedicated photo safari.

In terms of the photography I was surprised by how much I learnt during the trip under professional photographer Paul Joynson-Hicks guidance. Paul was a great guy and a real personality. He was incredibility knowledgeable about photography, the wildlife (especially the birds) and Tanzania as well as being a patient teacher. Having the opportunity to take photos during the day and then critique them in the laid back tutorials was great and I could really see the difference in my photography by the end of the week, especially with my composition. The only frustrating thing was knowing that some of my photos at the start of the week could've been so much better!

It was the trip of a lifetime and something I would recommend to anyone who has a keen interest in photography, wildlife and the finer things in life. I wanted to challenge myself and learn new skills as well as having an adventure to this amazing continent and on every level I was rewarded.

Capture were brilliant, Tim in the office is passionate about Africa and photography, everything ran like clockwork. In Paul they've got a great photographer who really made the difference to my trip.



## APPENDIX – FIAP DISTINCTIONS

## **Applications for the 2013 Submission**

(Editor – Whilst this is not the normal light reading of e-news I know there are a great many people working towards FIAP Distinctions who will wish to see this as soon as possible. Please read through it carefully as there are some changes.)

#### 1. Introduction

1.1 This document is intended as an information document for those who are interested in applying for any of the seven FIAP Distinctions for photographic merit, namely:AFIAP (Artist FIAP), EFIAP (Excellence FIAP), EFIAP/b (EFIAP Bronze), EFIAP/s (EFIAP Silver), EFIAP/g (EFIAP Gold), EFIAP/p (EFIAP Platinum) and MFIAP (Master FIAP)

It advises prospective applicants on how to go about making an application and provides information on how to obtain an "Applications Package". It sets out the timetable and an outline of the process. Apart from MFIAP (see para 4 below) the general process and timetable is the same for all awards.

1.2 It does not advise on preparing your records or the relevant criteria, for that information you should download the available documents on the FIAP pages of the PAGB web site at:-

http://www.pagb-photography-uk.co.uk/fiap\_2.htm

Please note there are substantial changes not only in the Criteria, but also to the FIAP Dossiers.

Read these documents first; they contain the information you will need to decide if you have met the criteria, and to help you organise your records prior to your application. Experienced exhibitors should not ignore the "Starting out on the Exhibition Trail" article; it does contain valuable updated information.

- 1.3 Neither does this document give you the guidelines for submitting an application. This information, which varies from award to award, is contained in the relevant "Applications Package".
- 1.4 **I would ask you, <u>without exception</u>, to conform to the time table set out below.** Whilst I would wish to be more flexible, this is simply not possible with the numbers of applications we are currently receiving.

## 2. <u>AFIAP / EFIAP / EFIAP Levels – Time Table</u>

- 2.1 There will only be one submission of applications in 2013. It is intended that all applications received within the timetable will be processed. In the light of last year's experience the process will start somewhat later, but there will still be ample time to complete the process.
- 2.2 Prospective applicants, who have achieved the criteria, should contact me to register by EMAIL at <a href="mailto:davecoates&btinternet.com">davecoates&btinternet.com</a> (remember to replace the & with a @) any time from:
  Monday 17<sup>th</sup> September August 2012 until Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> January 2013

On receipt of your email request, which should include your full name and address details including post code, and telephone number, as well as the application you intend applying for, I will forward you the appropriate "Applications Package" by email as soon as is practicable.

**PLEASE** do not contact me for registration until you have achieved the criteria. The process is not designed to deal with speculative requests in the hope or expectation of reaching targets before the deadline date. No registrations will be accepted after 31<sup>st</sup> January 2013; so it follows that if you have not achieved your target by then you must wait until the 2014 submission to apply.

Please understand that if you have only just reached your target, your application is bound to attract more scrutiny than with one safely over the criteria, and as we do not receive catalogues until sometime after a selection it is often not possible to verify last minute acceptances properly. Report Cards are unreliable and even PSA refuse to accept evidence other than by catalogue.

2.3 This will give members ample time to get their applications sorted into acceptable order. Once you have received the package PLEASE DO NOT contact me with queries or completed Dossier files until:-

## Monday 5<sup>th</sup> November 2012

They will not be responded to before this date and those who try to jump the queue will be put to the back of any formed by those who respect this request. There is plenty of time to deal with everything from November onwards. Once your Dossier file has been approved and sent back to you, you will be in a position to complete your application fully. However, to enable my family to enjoy Christmas without piles of applications around the house, please do not forward completed applications until on or after:-

### Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2013

2.4 The closing date for fully completed applications to reach me is:-

### Sunday 31st March 2013.

This leaves plenty of time to sort out your application, and also anyone who is looking to follow on from an award gained in 2012 there will be the necessary 12 months gap between applications.

#### 3. AFIAP / EFIAP / EFIAP Levels - Applications Packages

- 3.1 FIAP now require that PAGB now comply fully with their submission requirements, I have therefore prepared two new and separate "Applications Packages", one each for :
  - i) AFIAP/EFIAP Applicants and
  - ii) EFIAP Levels Applicants

These packages contain all the information for completion of an application, including for a FIAP Photographers' Cards where necessary. Please do not assume that, because you set out applications in a particular way in the past, that this will be allowed this time. **There have been substantial changes, some in your favour.** 

- 3.2 Please read the documents in the package carefully and prepare your application in line with the guidance. If you do have queries, please contact me by email (but not before 05/11/2012) and I will try to resolve them. Please note that due to the workload involved, if the answer is already in the package or the "Recently Asked Questions" download, any reply may simply direct you back to those documents.
- 3.3 Each "Applications Package" contains a FIAP Dossier File. These are multi-page Excel Files, and it is required that you use this document to prepare that part of your submission. It may not be hand written, nor may you attach ad hoc printouts from other software sources. We are aware that this may cause difficulties for some and the detailed guidance provided has been designed to cover as many of the problems as can be envisaged.
- To ensure a smooth process please complete the FIAP Dossier as early as practicable within the timetable. You should then forward a copy of the FIAP Dossier File to me by email for checking. Once we have got this correct you can put the full application together for submission.

#### 4. MFIAP Applications

- 4.1 Because the criteria, the method of assessment as well as the timetable for this award are totally different from all the other awards, the instructions differ from those for the other awards.
- 4.2 Applicants must have held EFIAP for at least 3 years from the date on their EFIAP Certificate. They are required to produce a Portfolio of 20 prints that is essentially a project in itself. The requirements for this are somewhat arcane and therefore the "Applications Package" for MFIAP is designed to assist you from the start of the process.
- 4.3 Anyone who feels that they might be interested in preparing work for an MFIAP Distinction should therefore contact me at the earliest stage, even before starting on your entry. Contact me by email, with your full name, address including Post Code and telephone number, and I will forward you an "Applications Package".
- 4.4 PLEASE NOTE:- Due to the nature of an MFIAP application I cannot advise you on the content or quality of the photographic part of your application. That is entirely down to you.
- 4.5 I would appreciate confirmation of whether you are going ahead with an application well in advance of its submission and I will try to assist wherever possible with preparation of the administrative side of your application. Simply contact me by email with any queries during the process.
- 4.6 You should aim to have your application completed and with me no later than:-

Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> January 2013

4.7 Your application, once sorted, will then be held by me until I can send all MFIAP applications to FIAP together, but they must reach FIAP by:-

Friday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2013.
